PUBLIC HEARING

 Out-Of-State Veterinary Medical Education Loan Repayment Program Rules and Regulations

The rules of the Out-of-State Veterinary Medical Education Program will be created to provide loan repayment to Mississippi State University (MSU) Veterinary graduates that have a minimum of thirty (30%) percent of his/her veterinary practice performing food supply veterinary medicine. The rules are necessary to comply with Act 881 of 2011.

Academic Challenge Rules and Regulations

The rules of the Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship will make dependents of veterans killed while performing military duty receive priority status if a lack of funds should exist. The rules are necessary to comply with Act 825 of 2011.

 New Instructional Unit: University of Arkansas Community College at Hope Off-Campus Instructional Center in Texarkana, Arkansas

The establishment of an off-campus instruction center in Texarkana, Arkansas, will provide the 43,000+ Miller County residents with broader access to higher education opportunities. First, the Center will provide general education coursework which will allow students to earn associate's degrees which prepare them to transfer into baccalaureate programs in Arkansas. Secondly, the Center will eventually offer certificates and associate of applied science degrees appropriate to serve the Miller County workforce demands. Finally, UACCH plans to expand the Center's services to provide non-credit workforce and community education.

The increased access provided by the off-campus instruction center will positively impact the educational attainment levels of Miller County residents and increase the college-going rates of Miller County high school graduates, thereby contributing to the economic stability of the region and of our state. Currently, 13.8% of Miller County residents who are 25 or older have obtained a bachelor's degree (U.S. Census Bureau, 2010). The college-going rates for students from the three Miller County public high schools in 2010 were 17.4%, 21.1%, and 21% (ADHE).

The Board of Trustees of the University of Arkansas has authorized UACCH to purchase 8.749 acres of property in Texarkana, Arkansas, located near the intersection of East 54th Street and Fair Park Drive. UACCH will construct a 10,000 square foot instructional facility on the site.

Arkansas State University-Jonesboro is proposing new undergraduate and graduate programs in Disaster Preparedness and Emergency Management. These programs will be provided on-line through the College of Nursing and Health Professions. The programs provide an interdisciplinary approach to prepare professionals to effectively meet the demands of disaster preparedness, mitigation, planning, response and recovery. The programs are management oriented and are not specifically homeland security-based. ASU-J is entering into a unique opportunity with the federal Center for Domestic Preparedness in Anniston, Alabama, which will provide students pursuing any of the programs with the opportunity to participate in training at the Center.

New Program: Henderson State University Bachelor of Science in Radiography

The degree is the result of a formal partnership between Henderson State University and Baptist Health Schools Little Rock. The two institutions will affiliate to provide education to future radiographers in the state of Arkansas. Radiographers are members of the healthcare team responsible for performing diagnostic x-ray examinations using ionizing radiation. The Bachelor of Science degree consists of 125 credit hours. Sixty-five credit hours (52%) are general education preparation provided by Henderson State University and 60 credit hours (48%) are professional curriculum provided by the Baptist Health School of Radiography. Students will take general education courses on the HSU campus and the professional courses will be provided on the Baptist Health campus in West Little Rock. The two institutions currently collaborate to offer a Bachelor of Science in Medical Technology.

New Programs: University of Arkansas, Fayetteville Master of Education and Doctor of Education in Adult and Lifelong Learning

The proposed master's and doctoral degree programs would replace the Adult Education concentration within the existing degrees in Workforce Development Education. The establishment of the Adult and Lifelong Learning major is in response to the issues that were identified during the academic review of the Workforce Development Education program during spring 2010. The recommendation of the external reviewers was to develop a discernable adult education curriculum. The program faculty reviewed the current adult education course offerings and felt that it was necessary to establish a new academic program in order to address the issues within the current program as noted by the external reviewers.

Current students enrolled in the adult education concentration in the Workforce Development Education program would be given the option to transfer to the new program or complete their degree in the existing program. Students pursuing the master's degree may also pursue Adult Education licensure in order to serve as adult education instructors at state-approved adult education and literacy programs. The doctoral courses will be offered in face-to-face, online, and blended formats. Face-to-face courses will be offered during evenings and weekends. Current faculty appointments will be sufficient to operate the program.

New Program: University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences Master of Physician Assistant Studies

The College of Health Related Professions (CHRP) of the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences is proposing a two-year education program leading to a Master of Physician Assistant Studies. Physician assistants (PA) are academically and clinically prepared to practice medicine

with the direction and responsible supervision of a doctor of medicine or osteopathy. Graduates of this program will work under the supervision of a physician to improve the delivery of primary care to the people of Arkansas and to improve the overall delivery of health care to Arkansans through increased efficiencies and effectiveness.

In 2000 Arkansas ranked last in the nation in the ratio of PAs to population and in 2011 it ranks fifth from last in its readiness to provide expanded Medicaid services called for under recent health care reform legislation. There is support for the program from a significant percentage of hospital administrators and from practicing physicians, and UAMS looks forward to educating the medical community on the role and value of physician assistants in a rural, largely medically underserved state.

The UAMS physician assistant program is supported by the Colleges of Health Related Professions, Medicine, Nursing, and Pharmacy. Much of the instruction to PA students in the foundations of clinical practice will be carried out by College of Medicine faculty. Medical and PA students will learn much of their clinical medicine together.

University of Central Arkansas Master of Fine Arts in Creative Writing

The Department of Writing in the College of Fine Arts and Communication at the University of Central Arkansas proposes a writing-intensive MFA studio program in Creative Writing that will uniquely prepare graduates for careers in writing pedagogy and publishing. This terminal degree program will be based on existing and new courses offered by the Department and will be supported by UCA's BA in Writing, its BA in Creative Writing, its BA in Linguistics, and graduate courses in Linguistics. This MFA will provide graduate students the opportunity to concentrate on the study, practice, and teaching of Creative Writing in a highly focused writing program taught primarily by writers for writers. At 60 hours, this three-year program will ensure that graduates build multi-genre backgrounds in the popular discipline of Creative Writing through workshops, forms courses, topics courses, a wide variety of electives, and specialized teaching and editing practicums. To ensure individualized attention, the program will admit 5 to 8 students annually.

Performance Funding

In accordance with Act 1203 of 2011, ADHE must present a performance centered component of the funding formulas to the AHECB for approval. Both the Four-Year institutions and Two-Year institutions have worked tediously developing the methodology and measures that provide the framework for this new component of the funding formula.

Report on Intercollegiate Athletic Revenues and Expenditures for 2010-11

Act 245 of 1989 (A.C.A.6-62-106) directed the Coordinating Board to develop and establish uniform accounting standards and procedures for reporting revenues and expenditures and, based on these standard definitions and formats, to collect the financial data and provide a uniform report of each institution's athletic revenues and expenditures. In addition, the Coordinating Board must provide a report to the Legislative Joint Audit Committee and the public by November of each year on each institution's athletic costs. In this agenda item, institutions have submitted reports of their actual intercollegiate athletic program revenues and expenditures for 2010-11 in the required format.

Economic Feasibility of Loan for University of Arkansas Community College at Hope (UACCH)

University of Arkansas Community College at Hope requests approval of the economic feasibility of plans to secure a loan from the College Savings Bond Revolving Loan Fund in the amount of \$1,100,000 with a term of 10 years and an estimated annual interest rate not to exceed 1.0 percent. Proceeds from the loan will be used to assist in the construction of an Instruction Services Center on property recently purchased in Texarkana, Arkansas. The University of Arkansas Board of Trustees approved this action at its meeting held on September 16, 2011.

Economic Feasibility of Bond Issue for University of Arkansas at Fort Smith (UAFS)

UAFS requests approval of the economic feasibility of plans to secure a loan from the Arkansas Sustainable Building Revolving Loan Fund (RLF) managed by the Arkansas Building Authority in the amount of \$1,900,000 with a term of up to 10 years at an estimated annual interest rate not to exceed 0.0 percent. Proceeds from the loan will be used to fund infrastructure upgrades on the UAFS campus, including the creation of a central energy plant to provide district cooling and district heating to various campus facilities and a campus lighting retrofit. The University of Arkansas Board of Trustees approved this action at its meeting held on September 16, 2011.

Economic Feasibility of Bond Issue for University of Central Arkansas (UCA)

University of Central Arkansas requests approval of the economic feasibility of plans to issue bonds in an amount not to exceed \$15.5 million with a term of 30 years at an estimated annual interest rate not to exceed 5.5 percent. Proceeds from the bond issue will be used for the expansion of the Health, Physical Education, and Recreation Center (HYPER). The University of Central Arkansas Board of Trustees approved this action at its meeting held on September 9, 2011.

Distribution of Mineral Lease Funds

The Department of Higher Education recommends that \$1 million from the Higher Education Research Development Fund be allocated to the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville for expenses associated with the operation of the Arkansas Research and Education Optical Network of all public universities.

Operating Recommendations for 2012-13 Fiscal Year

This agenda will consist of the operating recommendations for the 2012-13 Fiscal Year. The funding recommendations will be based upon eighty (80) percent of the census-date enrollment and twenty (20) percent of the end-of-term enrollment.

Bond/Loan Feasibility Update

This update consists of the actual terms for bond and loan issues receiving AHECB approval that occurred from July 2010 through October 2011. This update was requested by the AHECB during the July 30, 2010 quarterly meeting.

Update on Reporting of Maintenance Funds for New Facilities

Institutions seeking approval of a loan or a bond issue for the construction or purchase of a new facility must provide for the maintenance of that facility by transferring annually to plant fund \$2.50 per gross square foot, if it is an educational and general facility or \$1.25 per gross square foot, if it is an auxiliary facility. The transferred funds shall be designated for the new building. These funds will be transferred to the plant fund annually and shall begin in the fiscal year following the completion and occupancy of the facility and will continue as long as the building is in use. The funds can also be used for critical and deferred maintenance of the institution. No buildings are completed and occupied at this time.
