

REDUCE

RECYCLING ACCEPTED FOR FREE !!

Cardboard: Corrugated cardboard, food boxes, brown paper bags, feed sacks. Clean no plastic or Styrofoam in or on the cardboard

Plastic: Basically drinking bottles, laundry bottles, milk jugs and such.

Paper: Newspapers, copy paper, magazines, phonebooks, hard back books (with covers removed) and paperback books.

Tin: All vegetable cans, cat and dog food cans, coffee cans

Aluminum: Beverage cans and radiators.

Scrap Metal: Big bulky metal – grills, appliances (stoves, refrigerators, freezers)

Electronics: Televisions, computer monitors, cpu's, laptops.

TIRES: 4 passenger tires per day per person.

Fees apply to specialty tires (ATV, tractor, OTR tires). Check with cashier before dropping those off.

We are working on getting setting up to accept glass. Keep checking back with us to see if that is in place.

We are open Monday through Friday - 7 am to 4 pm and the 1st & 3rd Saturdays of each month from 8 am to 12 noon.

For closures: A good rule of thumb on holidays and inclement weather is, if the courthouse is closed, the Transfer Station will be closed also.

NEW PRICING STARTING JANUARY 2, 2014

ALL HOUSEHOLD TRASH MUST BE BAGGED OR IT WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED!

- **\$1.50 a bag up to and including 33 gallon** (5 Wal-Mart bags will usually fill a 33 gallon bag- or 3-13 gall tall kitchen bags)
- **\$2.50 a bag any bags above 33 gallon**
- **\$15.00 furniture per piece**
- **\$30.00 per cubic yard for Construction & Demolition debris**

(NO brick or masonry items please)

4 tires per day per person any over that will be \$1.00 a tire per OMSWD

Permits are no longer being issued. Any current permits will be honored until they expire.

RECYCLING REDUCES TRASH

RECYCLING can be your friend in more ways than you may have thought. Not only does proper disposal of plastic, metal, cardboard, electronics, tires and household waste prevent pollution of our water and air, ***it will reduce the amount you have to pay to dispose of it and fines for illegal dumping or burning.***

Did you know that 70% of the garbage generated and discarded in a residential household is made up of materials that can be recycled? For every 100 pounds of materials that normally would have been thrown away and taken to a landfill, 70 lbs. could have been diverted to a solid waste recycling facility. It is estimated that each household generates an average of 35 lbs. of solid waste each day if you do not separate your recyclables. The numbers add up. (35 lbs. x 365 days/yr. = 12,775 lbs. or 6.39 tons).

Recyclables such as cardboard, paper, plastic, metal, tires, computers, TVs are accepted at the Marion County Transfer Station ***free of charge.*** Don't wait for a cleanup day- you can bring these items at

any time. Bring them with you when you bring your trash. These recyclable items are sold to offset operation costs and make Improvements to the transfer station. We do have to charge you an additional amount for construction material, mattresses/box springs, furniture, cabinets, doors, etc. It costs us extra to dispose of these items, therefore that cost is passed on to you.

Per Arkansas Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) and Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulations, disposal and/or burning of anything other than yard waste on your land, in a ditch alongside the road or on someone else's, is illegal. Doing either one of these can result in you being fined.

All household trash must be bagged. If it's not bagged it will not be accepted.

Reduce your 3 bags of trash going into the compactor down to 1 bag by recycling and reusing.

Recyclables may be brought in your own container and you can take it back home with you.

CHANGES

The reason for the change in pricing is due to; Nabors' going out of business, closing the landfill, and people abusing the permit system. Previously it cost roughly \$1,445.00 a week for us to send trash to Midway, Arkansas. Now it costs roughly \$2,850.00 a week plus 4.3% fuel surcharge to the hauler and it has to be shipped to IESI in Cherokee Village, Arkansas.

As an individual the biggest help you can be to us and yourself is RECYCLE. Not only will it cut your cost of disposing of trash but it will cut our costs by reduction in volume going out and bring more money in from sales of recycling to improve and update the Transfer Station.

For your convenience, you may now go straight up the hill to the compactor to pay for your trash.
