**PULASKI COUNTY CIRCUIT AND COUNTY CLERK'S OFFICE TEMPORARY  
OPERATIONS EXTENDED THROUGH MAY 17, 2020**

**(LITTLE ROCK, ARK.)** – The Pulaski County Circuit and County Clerk's office and Pulaski County Courthouse will remain closed to the public through Sunday, May 17, 2020. Earlier today, Pulaski County Judge Barry Hyde released an executive order extending his previous order through Sunday, May 17, 2020.

Pulaski County Circuit and County Clerk Terry Hollingsworth announced continued temporary operations for her office. Limited in-person services are available from the clerk's office 8:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Requests for orders of protection may be made in person at the courthouse.

Commissioner Sales will take place, as scheduled, weekly on Thursdays at 12:00 p.m., and will be conducted outside the Pulaski County Courthouse's Markham Street entrance. Sales are listed on the clerk's website as they are scheduled.
